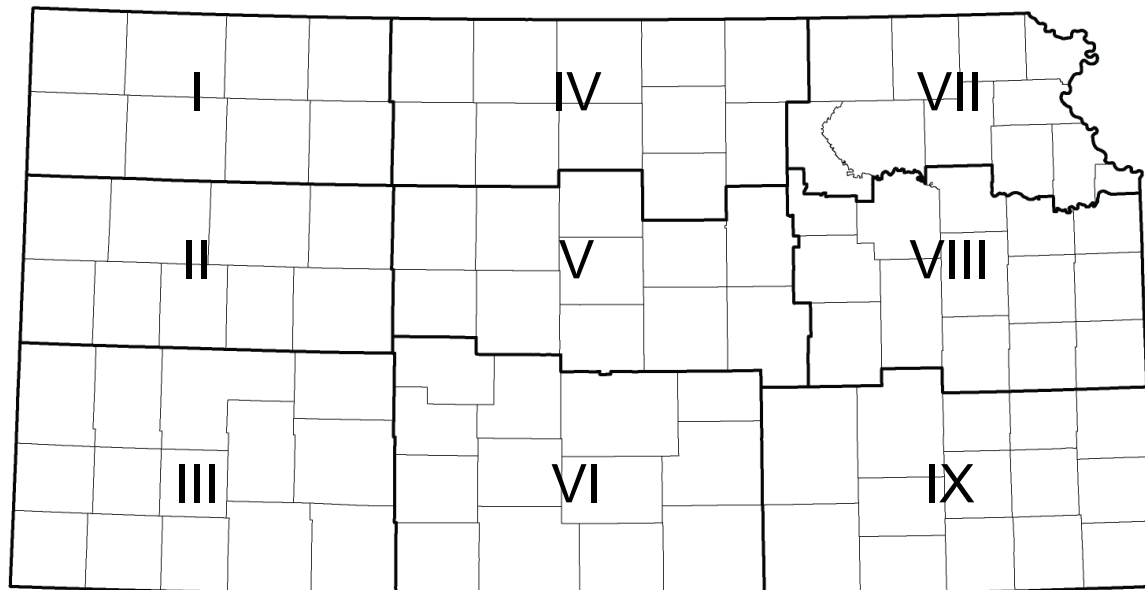

Kansas Grain Commodity Commission Voter Registration

To register to vote in the grain commodity commission elections, you must be:

- a resident of Kansas.
- of legal voting age at the time of the election.
- actively engaged in growing corn, grain sorghum, soybeans, sunflowers, or wheat within the preceding three years.

You may obtain this form from the following locations:

This form must be postmarked or received by the Kansas Department of Agriculture no later than December 31, 2009, for an eligible grower to be registered to vote in the upcoming election.

Election Procedure

Registering to vote by **December 31, 2009**, either by completing the voter registration application form (to the right), or by signing a valid candidate petition form, will ensure that eligible voters will receive a ballot that will be mailed by **January 15, 2010**. You have until **March 1, 2010**, to submit your ballot to the Kansas Department of Agriculture. The candidate who wins will take office **April 1, 2010**.

Any challenge of voter eligibility, the petition process, or any other election procedure must be submitted in writing to the secretary of agriculture between **February 20, 2010**, and one week after ballots are officially counted and winners announced. The secretary of agriculture or his/her designee, will be the final arbiter in any disputes that may arise out of the election procedure.

Frequently Asked Questions

Who is eligible to vote?

Any grower who appropriately registers to vote may do so in an election for any commissioner representing that commodity and district where the grower maintains an official residence. Anyone who is a resident of Kansas, has reached the age of 18 before the next election and has been actively engaged in growing corn, grain sorghum, soybeans, sunflowers, or wheat within the preceding three years qualifies as a grower.

How do I register and vote?

- Fill out the voter registration form (to the right) or sign a valid candidate's petition.
- An election ballot will be mailed to you by January 15 of that election year.
- Return the completed election ballot by March 1 of that election year.

How can I become a commodity commission election candidate?

Contact your county extension office, county conservation district office, the Kansas Department of Agriculture, or any of the five grain commodity commission offices (corn, grain sorghum, soybeans, sunflowers, or wheat) for an official candidate petition form.

Where can I get a registration form?

The Kansas Grain Commodity Commission Voter Registration is included in this brochure. Brochures may be obtained from your county extension office, your county conservation district office, the Kansas Department of Agriculture, or any of the five grain commodity commission offices (corn, grain sorghum, soybeans, sunflowers, or wheat). You may also register by signing a valid candidate petition form, or you may register online at: www.ksda.gov/kansas_agriculture/content/152.
